

Some Facts

Skill Gap:

Machine Operator, Technician, Supervisor, Middle Management, etc.

→ Lack:

- Leather Sector Research, Design & Development
- Curricula not matched with Industry need
- Need for On-the-Job Training
- Need for Demand Driven Short Courses









Some Industry Skill Facts

- → About 30,000 skill labour shortage only this year
- World's biggest Footwear factory is being set up by Youngone at Chittagong where they will be employing over 30,000 workers
- ➡ FDI is arriving in this sector particularly from Taiwan, China, and availability of skilled people will be the main issue.

A Memorandum of Understanding has been signed between USAID funded Poverty Reduction by Increasing the Competitiveness of Enterprises (PRICE) and Centre of Excellence for Leather (COEL) on April 10, 2011

Planned Activities for Future

- Piloting Three Priority Occupations
- Piloting Apprenticeship Program for Machine Operator, Machine Maintenance Technician & Supervisor in partnership with DTE & BMET











Apprenticeship for Leather Sector Pilot Project Description

- The focus is to promote apprenticeship system for the machine operators (sewing, cutting and lasting) of the footwear sector.
- A total of 2880 skilled machine operators in 72 batches will be developed and supplied to the industry of which 50% is sewing, 33% is lasting and 17% is cutting machine operators.
- Of the total apprentices, around **70% will be female**
- The total duration of the pilot program is 12 months
- Each trainee can earn up to level 2 as per the proposed National Vocational Qualification Framework (NVQF) by end of 01 year. They will have further opportunity for level up-gradation.
- Apprentices progress monitored via log book based on competency standards


